Our 5 finalists were 5th years: Oran O'Reilly, Laoise McNamara, Éabha Cooney, Claire McNamara, and Penelope Stafferton. The book they nominated was Sebastian Barry's 'Days Without End'.

The overall winner was Penelope Stafferton with her essay: An Irish Book for an International Prize. Laoise McNamara was runner up with: Real Situations, good and bad, have finally been talked about. Thank you to the Heinrich Boll committee, who invited finalists to a presentation in St. Thomas' Church. The five prizewinners received their awards from the German Ambassador to Ireland, Cord Meier-Klodt.

On Feb 10th, our 3rd, TY, 5th & 6th Years were honoured to have Jackie Fox as a guest speaker. Over the past couple of years Jackie has been campaigning and talking to schools across the country about 'Coco's Law.' Unfortunately, in 2018 Jackie lost her daughter Nicole to suicide. Nicole had been the victim of physical bullying but also online bullying. Jackie fought for legislation, which was passed by Michael D Higgins, to make online bullying a criminal office in Ireland. The Bill, known as 'Coco's Law', makes online harassment, stalking, and sharing intimate images online without consent, crimes punishable by law. Although Jackie's talk was hard hitting, we feel that it is of huge importance for students to understand the importance of online safety and the consequences that can lead from their actions.
